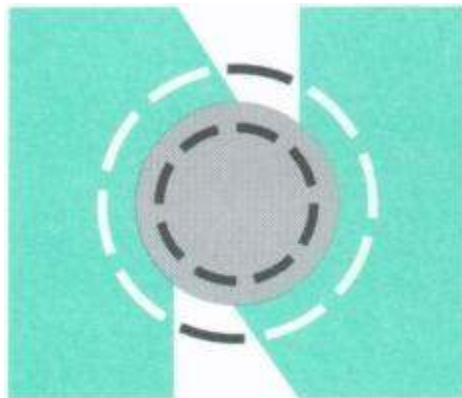

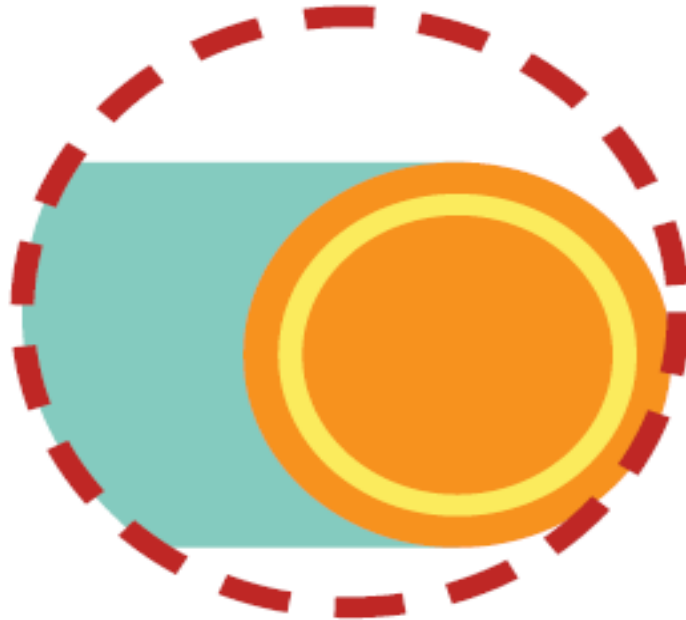

Artist Interpretation

The consistent circular motif shows the entirety that the Neuman Systems Model attains. The circles not only represent entirety but are also arranged in a way that may call to mind the shape of a cell. Therefore, both the global and specific issues from assisting a group or single individual are addressed. Incorporating a map to portray a global focus came across as distracting and complicated with the simplicity of the design. The exterior circle shows the red exterior stressor on top of the inner circle which represents the core of the NSM. The red line is outside of the inner circle to represent that it has not broken into the core. Orange is a comforting color and the yellow circle inside shows vibrancy and represents the inner line of defense against the exterior stressor(s). The teal color is chosen as both a visual reminder of the original NSM logo and to demonstrate speed and motion. The teal stripe achieves this by following behind the interior orange circle as a path following where the interior circle is moving.

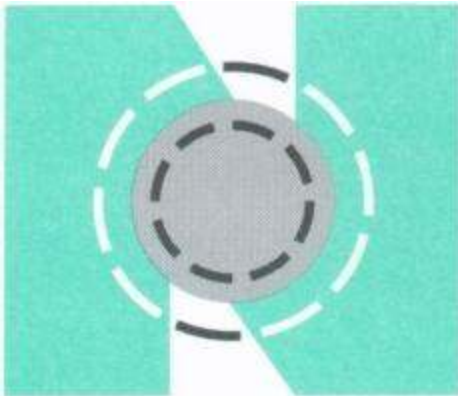
